ORDINANCE NO. 12 - 2010

ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 45 OF THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF RIVERDALE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Riverdale, in the County of Morris and State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 45, Section 45-12, entitled "Longevity pay," Subsection A., shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

A. In addition to base salaries, employees shall be entitled to longevity pay which shall be a percentage of base salaries determined by the number of years of continuous employment in full-time capacity, as follows:

Number of Years	Percent Per Year
1 to 5	No compensation
6 to 10	2
11 to 15	4
16 to 20	6
21 to 24	8
Over 24	10

Section 2. If any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held invalid in any Court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect the other sections or provisions of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances which are inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately after final passage and publication in the manner provided by law.
